## **Valley Mourns Nagle Dam Drownings**

The Nagle Dam community was plunged into mourning yesterday afternoon as news of the shock

drowning of two teenagers came to light. Sanele Ninela and Siyabonga Madondo, both 17, were trying to paddle on the dam on Wednesday, but their boat capsized barely 50m from the shore. Witnesses braaing on the banks of the dam immediately notified the dam authorities and police navy divers arrived at the scene later, but had to call off the search in the dark to resume this morning. They have since recovered both bodies.

Reports from the area suggest that the teenagers arrived at the dam after lunch, and picked up a K2 kayak off the ground next to the local Lembethe Canoe Club racks. Ninela had apparently attended one of the daily supervised training sessions in the past, but neither of the boys were affiliated to Canoeing South Africa (CSA) or the club, and had not undertaken any proficiency tests. The Lembethe Canoe Club has a signed up membership of over 50 paddlers, and holds regular supervised training in the afternoons with a CSA appointed coach.

Local CSA development coach Lucas Mthlane was very upset upon hearing the news, and said, "Everyone here knows we train in the afternoons. I have seen Sanele once when I helped him last week to paddle. He put on a life jacket and managed to do okay. I have never met Siyabonga – they are both not from this area."

CSA Development Coordinator Martin Dreyer was devastated by the news. "It's especially sad when someone loses their life having fun, and our condolences go out to their families and the community at large," said Dreyer afterwards. "Safety has been my number one concern with all development clubs across South Africa," he added. "CSA doesn't support or pay any development coach who doesn't sign the coaches contract, which stipulates that all paddlers must wear kayaking jackets whenever they are on the water. Lucas is a very responsible person who has passed his swift water rescue course, and had one of these young boys joined one of his organised sessions, this tragedy would have been avoided. We will need to investigate further though, to put systems in place that ensure this doesn't happen again."

CSA General Manager Graham Bird was equally shocked at the incident. "It's devastating for the boy's families, who lost their sons to a recreational activity. All paddler's will be saddened by this news and our thoughts go out to the people close to Sanele and Siyabonga. It appears this incident was unavoidable due to non-members paddling outside of the clubs training sessions, and is ultimately why we urge aspiring paddlers to join their local club and go through the proficiency process before they take up canoeing by themselves."

As per the decision taken at the last sprint committee meeting the next Residential Squad team trial will take place on the 27/28th November 2010 at Nagle Dam in Kwazulu Natal.

All current squad members excluding Bridgitte Hartley, Jen Hodson, Shaun Rubenstein and Mike Arthur are required to attend the trial.

This trial is an open trial allowing any CSA members to come and try out for selection to the CSA Residential Squad. Indications are that the current size of the residential squad will remain constant, subject to standard, with the possibility of the residential squad reducing at the next squad trials to be held in the first half of 2011 (see below).

The dates of the next trial for the Residential squad as well as the trials for the World Cup and World Champs team will be decided after a meeting with the Sprint committee, SSISA and the coaches in mid October and will be announced shortly thereafter.

The November trial will be held over the following distances:

K1, K2 all Olympic distances.

## Jenkins untouchable in first Dusi seeding race

Len Jenkins stamped his name firmly at the top of the rankings for The Unlimited Dusi 2011 with a five minute plus win over Ant Stott and Michael Mbanjwa in the 30km Unlimited Ozzie Gladwin on Sunday. After a five boat race around the initial flat-water section on Albert Falls Dam he led the bunch of Stott, Mbanjwa, Mark Mulder and Wayne Wilson into the portage around the dam wall, stormed up the hill to take the hot-spot prize at the crest and then on down to do the same at the Albert Falls Weir. Stott, lying second at this stage, took an unexpected swim at the weir where Mbanjwa caught up to him. Stott managed to break away eventually to take second place overall by almost two minutes from Mbanjwa.

In the boy's race Brandon van der Walt took the honours in an excellent 5th place overall coincidentally giving the race three World Marathon podium finishers in the first five – Jenkins Bronze in 2010, van der Walt junior Gold in 2009 and Stott Gold K2 and Bronze K1 in 2008. Mmeli Cele from Martin Dreyer's Change-a-Life project at Nagle Dam took the second place in the boy's race. Blaine Beresford came into the final rapid just above the finish line at Thornvale farm in third spot but took a swim allowing U16 Donovan Wewege to slip past before he could regain his seat in the canoe.

U16 Brittany Petersen showed some of the form that earned her a place at the recent Olympic Hopes regatta in Europe when she outsprinted the rest of the special women's batch to claim the Hot Spot at the crest of the dam wall portage. Experience told eventually though as the three leading women Abby Adie, Hillary Pitchford and Donna Winter managed to overtake her before the finish, with Adie winning by more than 4 minutes from Pitchford. Petersen held off a strong final challenge from Kerry Segal to win the girls race by 15seconds with Jenna Ward in third place.

Natal Canoe Club and new race and Dusi sponsors, The Unlimited, put together a very classy event much enjoyed by the final entry of over 620 paddlers which made the "Ozzie" the biggest one day race of the year and set a very high standard for all future one day races in KZN. By holding back during the week water normally running steadily between Albert Falls dam and Nagle Dam, Umgeni Water were able to

provide an excellent 12 cumec release for the race without wasting any water at all, a win-win for all in this time of dwindling water resources.

The race was also the first of a number of seeding races for the Unlimited Dusi 2011 setting the first two rows of A Batch on Day 1.

## NEW BALANCE FISH HOEK SURF CHALLENGE

Fish Hoek -In quite the most extreme wind conditions ever experienced since the start of local surfski series racing in 1998, Dawid Mocké posted his maiden victory in the 2010 Discovery Sunglass Hut Surfski series, mastering the gale force winds and overcoming a strong field to clinch the title over a course shortened by the ferocious weather conditions.

Mocké had to call on every ounce of his strength, stamina and acquired skill to hold off his Fish Hoek clubmates Shaun "The Prawn" Rice and Tom "Tommygun" Schilperoort to win the appropriately named New Balance Fish Hoek Surf Challenge.

"Tom beat me fair-and-square last weekend at Langebaan and Shaun had nailed me to the wall well-and-truly in Simonstown Bay on the Sunday before that, so I had to pull out all the stops to-day by putting the hammer down from the gun," said a visibly relieved Mocké.

Just on 85 boats ventured out for the testing race, which started with a first ever mass-start in knee deep water, after the race backers New Balance and the race organisers agreed to make paddlers safety their top priority in the difficult conditions.

The fleet had to race alongside the relatively protected waters next to Jaeger's Catwalk before heading into the 60km per hour south-easterly gale and then turning 600m off-shore at a turning-buoy next to Sunnycove Rail-station.

The paddlers were then required to race downwind for about 800m toward the second turning buoy anchored just off the club lifeguards'-tower on Fish Hoek beach before completing the short 1km triangular circuit at a third turning-buoy situated on the surf-line directly in front of the Baysider Restaurant and original starting-point.

The race was shortened to five laps within the relatively protected area in the Fish Hoek bay, effectively reducing the race distance by two-thirds to five kilometres. The format still required each paddler to strategise as they weaved their line through the a field of slower-moving back-markers, and ultimately to the finish-line on the beach directly in front of the lifesavers' clubhouse.

"That was most definitely the meanest race I've ever been in in my life" said a clearly strained Tom Schilperoort who looked as if he needed a glucose drip after the race as a result of what he referred to as a 'severe case of lactic-acid overload' in his body.

Nikki Mocké kept it in the family once again by completing a Mocké cleansweep by winning the women's title, finishing less than four minutes behind her husband, and just outside of the top ten overall, with Bianca Beavitt and Kim Brugmann claiming the other two podium places.

14 year old schoolgirl Kirsten Flanagan earned the respect of her fellow paddlers by winning the junior girls title, despite the intimidating weather conditions, while Dominique Notten held off Kenny Rice to win the junior boys title.

Bruce Neill and Pierre Van Dyk took the double ski title, while the mixed doubles title fell once again to the evergreen husband-and-wife crew of series organisers Billy and Tracey Harker.

The fourth race in the series is the Discovery Downwind race on 7 November.

## Von Wildemann claims third PE series race in solo charge

Port Elizabeth - Top ranking series competitor Richard von Wildemann claimed his third series race title after winning the Island Tribe Island Classic, which forms part of the Eastern Cape Discovery SunGloss Hut Surf Ski Series.

In fairly flat conditions paddlers lined up at Blue Water Bay set to tackle the 16.7 kilometre race, which lead paddlers from the start through the new Nggura Harbour and around Jahill Island and back to the finish at Blue Water Bay.

With the absence of Greg Louw, who is currently part of the Olympic Sprint Training Camp, Von Wildemann had to dig deep to stay focused and continue to push himself at an elitist speed. "I pretended I had the likes of Hank McGregor, Dawid Mocke and Matt Bouman in front of me, which kept me focused," laughed Von Wildemann.

As no stranger to the prime podium position Von Wildemann welcomed his third win of the current series by finishing a full six minutes ahead of the remainder of the field.

Series regulars Hein van Rooyen and Craig Walland formed part of the chasing bunch, which ended in a sprint finish at Blue Water Bay with van Rooyen crossing the line mere seconds in front of Walland who settled for third position. Jason Kalogeropoulos and Rob Welsh followed in fourth and fifth

consecutively.

The ladies race is beginning to heat up in recent weeks, however Kirsty Wessels still managed to maintain her current series standing by claiming her third title. Hilde Lapere, paddling as a Master, managed an impressive second place with Kerry Louw coming in third position.

Neil Murray left the beach with the short course title in hand and was followed close behind by Andre van Rensburg and Paul Gerrard with second and third positions respectively.

The Discovery Sunglass Hut Surfski Series continues with the Discovery Downwind Blast on Saturday, 6 November.
